



### THE YEAR OF STAINT JOSEPH



The Pope has declared 2021 the year of St. Joseph, the guardian of Mary and adopted father of Jesus. Who is Saint Joseph? Popes throughout the ages have recognized the importance of St. Joseph and in 1870 Pope Pius IX declared him the Patron of the Catholic Church. Although his feast day is March 19, in 1955 Pope Pius XII established the Feast of St. Joseph the Worker on May 1 to present St. Joseph

as the exemplar of all working men and to focus on the true dignity of human labor in contrast to the "May Day" celebrations of communist countries. May each of us honor and cherish the example of St. Joseph, trusting in his prayers to help us on the path of salvation! #### FEAST OF SAINT BLAISE

February 3rd is the feast day of St. Blaise and Father Suresh will bless throats after the 9:00am Mass. St. Blaise was a Bishop during the 3rd century who was tortured and beheaded rather than give up his faith. He was known for many miraculous cures, the one we are most familiar with when he cured a child who was suffering from disease of the throat and in commemoration of that miracle came the practice of blessing of the throat on his feast day.
