
# <u>Update</u>

Jesus' baptism by John shows us the importance of receiving the sacrament of Baptism. Baptism is the doorway to the spiritual life. Christianity is not just about being a "good person" or "doing the right thing". To be a Christian is to be drawn into the inner dynamics of the inner life of God and becoming a member of his Mystical body. Baptism draws us into the relationship between the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. Baptism, therefore is all about our incorporation, through the power of God's love into God's own life.
