## Religious Education



The red poppy has become a symbol of the sacrifices made by our Veterans and those who made the ultimate sacrifice.

Early on the morning of May 3, 1915, John McCrae sat wearily near his field dressing station, a crude bunker cut into the slopes of a bank near the Ypres-Yser Canal in Belgium. As he sat in the early morning sunshine, he could hear the birds signing between the crash of the guns and he could see the rows of crosses in a nearby cemetery. The field where the cemetery lay was thick with scarlet poppies, their dormant seeds churned up by the guns, blooming despite the carnage. He took in the scene and wrote a 15 line poem "In Flanders Field".

In Flanders fields the poppies blow  
Between the crosses, row on row;  
That mark our place; and in the sky  
The larks, still bravely singing, fly  
Scarce heard amid the guns below.

We are the Dead. Short days ago  
We lived, felt dawn, saw sunset glow,  
Loved and were loved, and now we lie  
In Flanders fields.

Take up our quarrel with the foe;  
To you from failing hands we throw  
The torch; be yours to hold it high.  
If ye break faith with us who die  
We shall not sleep, through poppies grow  
In Flanders fields.
