### THE ADVENT WREATH



Traditionally, Advent wreaths are constructed of a circle of evergreen branches into which four candles (3 purple and one rose) are inserted,

representing the four weeks of Advent. Each candle symbolizes:

- 1. Prayer
- 2. Penance
- 3. Rejoicing as we are close to Christmas
- 4. Preparatory sacrifices

The progressive lighting of the candles symbolizes the expectation and hope surrounding our Lord's first coming into the world and the anticipation of his second coming to judge the living and the dead.
