Veterans Day

Veterans Day is a day to celebrate all those who have served in the Armed Forces both in war and peace.

Veterans Day was originally known as Armistice Day when an agreement was reached between the Allied nations and Germany to end the hostilities at the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month, for that reason November 11, 1918, is generally regarded as the end of "the war to end all wars."

An act approved on May 13, 1938, made the 11th of November in each year a legal holiday – a day to be dedicated to the cause of world peace and to be thereafter celebrated and known as "Armistice" Day". Armistice Day was a day set aside to honor veterans of World War I, but in 1954, after World War II had required the greatest mobilization of soldiers, sailors, marines and airmen in the Nation's history: after American Forces had fought aggression in Korea, the 83rd Congress, amended the Act of 1938 by striking out the word "armistice" and inserting in its place the word Veterans. With the approval of this legislation on June 1, 1954, November 11th became a day to honor American veterans of all wars. Under the Uniform Holiday Bill signed in 1968 Veterans Day was moved to fall on a Monday giving workers a three-day weekend. The first Veterans Day under the new law was celebrated on October 25, 1971. It became apparent that celebrating Veterans Day on November 11 had significant historic and patriotic meaning, therefore on September 20, 1975 President Gerald Ford signed a Public Law which returned the annual observance of Veterans Day to November 11 beginning in 1978.

Veterans Day continues to be observed on November 11 this not only preserves the historical significance of the date but helps focus attention on the important purpose of Veterans Day: A celebration to honor America's veterans for their patriotism, love of country, and willingness to serve and sacrifice for the common good.
