Religious Education Immaculate Conception December 8



The Immaculate Conception is a Catholic dogma that states that Mary was conceived without original sin or its stain. That's what "Immaculate" means, without stain. Some people think it refers to Christ's conception in Mary's womb without the intervention of a human father; but that is the **Virgin Birth.** Some believe that it means Mary was conceived "by the power of the Holy Spirit" just as Jesus

was, but that too, is incorrect. The essence of original sin consists in the deprivation of sanctifying grace, and its stain is a corrupt nature. Mary was in state of sanctifying grace from the first moment of her existence.

The doctrine of the Immaculate Conception was officially defined by Pope Pius IX in 1854. Doctrines are defined formally only when there is a controversy that need to be cleared up or when the magisterium (church teacher) thinks the faithful can be helped by particular emphasis being drawn to some already-existing belief. The definition of the Immaculate Conception was prompted by the latter move. Pope Pius IX, who was highly devoted to the Blessed Virgin, hoped the definition would inspire others in their devotion to her. (Information is from Catholic Answers.com)
