St. John Paul encouraged the Catholic Faith Community around the world to celebrate and reflect on youth and young adults annually on Christ the King Sunday. So let me tell you about a young man who is not yet a saint but is on his way to becoming one.

Carlo Acutis born May 3, 1991 and died of fulminating acute promyelocytic leukemia on October 12, 2006. He was a young Italian Catholic youth who had a great devotion to

the Holy Eucharist. Like all young men he liked sports, video games and working on his computer. He was an amateur computer programmer and created a website and documented Eucharistic miracles from around the world. (miracolieucharistic.org) He began this work at the age of 11 and completed it in 2005 at the age of 14. He was known for defending disabled peers at school when bullies mocked them and outside school, he did volunteer work with the homeless and destitute. When he developed leukemia, he offered his suffering both for Pope Benedict XVI and for the Catholic Church, Saying: "I offer to the Lord the sufferings that I will have to undergo for the Pope and for the Church.

In 2013 he was named "A Servant of God" the first stage towards sainthood. On 14 November 2019 the Vatican's Medical Council of the Congregation for the Causes of Saints expressed a positive opinion concerning a miracle in Brazil.

A young man was born with a pancreatic defect, his mother prayed a novena to Carlo and shortly thereafter her son said he felt healed. Pope Francis confirmed the miracle's authenticity in a decree on 21 February 2020. Carlo was beatified in a ceremony October 10<sup>th</sup>, 2020. It is believed that when he is canonized he will be the Saint of the Internet.
