

Religious Education

Our church is named after St. Francis de Sales, just who is St. Francis de Sales. Francis was born to a noble family in Switzerland on August 21, 1567. He was both gentle and intelligent and from an early age he knew he had a vocation to the priesthood, however kept this from his family as they had different plans for him. He attended the University of Paris and received a doctorate in law at the University of Padua. He never lost his passion for God but kept quiet about his devotion.

God had plans for Francis and one day while Francis was riding God made his plan clear. Francis fell from his horse three times that day and every time he fell the sword came out of the scabbard and came to rest on the ground in the shape of a Christian cross.

After much discussion and disagreement from his father Francis was ordained to the priesthood and in 1593 was elected provost of the Diocese of Geneva. This was during the time of the Protestant reformation, and he decided he should lead an expedition to bring the 60,000 Calvinist back to the Catholic Church. For three years, in good weather and bad he trudged through the countryside and had doors slammed in his face and rocks thrown at him. In the winter his feet froze and bled as he tramped through the snow. As a result, he wrote little pamphlets to explain the Catholic doctrine and slipped them under the doors. It is believed that as a result he brought 40,000 people to the church. He forged wonderful alliances with Pope Clement VIII and heads of state. In 1602 he was ordained Bishop of Geneva. In 1608 he wrote his famous book "INTRODUCTION TO THE DEVOUT LIFE. It became an instant success all over Europe though some clergy rejected the notion that lay men and women could achieve holiness in the experience of their daily life. Some tore it up because Francis encouraged dancing and jokes!

In 1610 he founded the Order of Visitation. He laid the groundwork for the teaching of the Second Vatican Council on what is now called the universal call to holiness. He believed the worst sin was to judge someone or to gossip about them. He died on December 28, 1622. St. Francis was beatified on January 8, 1661, and canonized on April 19, 1665, by Pope Alexander VII. In 1923 Pope Pius XI named him the patron saint of Catholic writers and the Catholic press. He is also the patron saint of the deaf, journalists, adult education and the Sisters of St. Joseph. His feast day is celebrated on January 24.
