Saint John's Bible

St. John's Bible is a work of art and a work of theology. A team of artists led by Donald Jackson used the ancient techniques of calligraphy and illumination to create this Bible commissioned by St. John's Addey and

University in Collegeville, Minnesota.

St. John's Bible is the first handcrafted Bible to be commissioned by a Benedictine monastery in 500 years. No project of its kind has been undertaken since the advent of the printing press in the 15th century. It is on display at St. Alphonsus Hospital in the radiology waiting room and is well worth seeing.

Saint Anthony Abbot

On January the 17th we celebrate the life of St. Anthony Abbot who was a holy man that lived by God's word. (Not to be confused with St. Anthony of Prada). His parents passed away when he was a young man of 18 and he inherited 300 acres and the responsibility of a younger sister.

One day at church he heard the reading from Matthew 19:21-24: "If you wish to be perfect, go, sell what you possess and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, follow me." Anthony then left the church and sold his possessions except for what he and his sister needed to live on. Later he sent his sister to a convent and he left his village to live a life of prayer, fasting and manual labor in the Egyptian desert. Throughout his life he wrestled with the temptations from the devil who wanted him to leave the ascetic life Anthony had chosen. After one such bout he was so beaten his friends thought he was dead and carried him to the church. After one particular difficult struggle Anthony called out to God, "Where were you when I needed you? God answered him:" I was here watching your struggle. Because you didn't give in, I will stay with you and protect you forever."

Although he never attended school philosophers came to him as he was seen as a wise man and was often called upon to prevent and cure diseases in people and animals. He is known as the Patron Saint of grave diggers, butchers, skin diseases.
