St. Francis de Sales Eucharistic Procession

Sunday, June 2 was the feast of The Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ, also known as Corpus Christi Sunday. We celebrated with our 2nd annual Eucharistic Procession around the St. Francis de Sales Campus. Those who attended the morning Mass were invited to participate thus giving them the opportunity to participate more fully in the life of the parish community.

When the Eucharist is carried in a solemn procession it is an outward sign of Christian people giving public witness of the faith and devotion toward the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist.

Pope Francis in his Homily on the solemnity of the Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ said: "The procession with the Blessed Sacrament . . . reminds us that we are called to go out and bring Jesus to others. To go out with enthusiasm, bringing Christ to those we meet in our daily lives."

Bishop Cary was the celebrant at Blessed Sacrament in Ontario, Oregon on Monday, May 27, 2024 for the National Eucharistic Procession.

It was a standing room only crowd within the church with overflow filling the basement, and street. The procession to Corpus Christi Catholic Church was 4 miles long and when they arrived, the church was overflowing with parishioners and visitors.

Luke Gilmer and Craig Norman said, "It was the most wonderful experience. Seeing all of the Catholic families celebrating the Eucharist was so moving. " Luke commented, "It was a good thing that the fire marshal wasn't around as we were really out of compliance for capacity."
