Saint Mother Teresa of Calcutta Feast Day September 5th

St. Mother Teresa was born was born Agnes Bojaxhiu on August 26, 1910 in Serbia. She was born into wealth and prosperity but despite the wealth and prosperity she grew up in a family with strong moral values.

When Agnes turned 18, she left and joined an Irish order of nuns and later that year traveled to India and began work with the sisters of the Loreto

Order. In 1937, she took the permanent vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience and adopted the title of Mother.

By 1943, India was plagued with famine and religious unrest between the Muslims and Hindus. This forced many nuns and religious orders to leave India and others moved their schools outside the city. Mother Teresa became headmistress of her school and wrote to her mother telling her mother how happy she was with teaching and her work. Her mother wrote back to her: "Dear child, do not forget that you went to India for the sake of the poor."

In 1946, Mother Teresa became quite ill and was told she needed rest. In September of that year, she left for Darjeeling, for a retreat. On that train ride she had what she called "the call within the call" By age forty Mother Teresa left the Loreto Order and founded the "Sisters of Charity" and began living among the poorest of the poor.

For the next five decades she lived a life of simplicity and

dedicated her life to the poorest of the poor. She once said "I believe in person-to-person contact. Every person is Christ for me, and since there is only one Jesus, the person I am meeting is the one person in the world at that moment." Mother Teresa placed Jesus at the center of her life.

In time Mother Teresa was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize, the United States Medal of Freedom, and the United Nations Albert Schweitzer Prize. Although she was considered by many to be a living saint, she did not allow that to influence her in any way and continued to remain committed to a life of service. There are more than 4500 Missionaries of Charity in 133 countries who continue to follow the path of Mother Teresa.

This is one of her quotes in "Do Something Beautiful for God." "The greatest disease in the West today is not tuberculosis or leprosy; it is being unwanted, unloved and uncared for. We can cure physical diseases with medicine, but the only cure for loneliness, despair, and hopelessness is love. There are so many people in the world who are dying for a piece of bread, but there are many more people dying for a little love. The poverty in the West is a different kind of poverty—it is not only a poverty of loneliness but also a profound spirituality poverty. There's a hunger for love, as there is a hunger for God."
