CHRISM MASS AND THE BLESSING OF THE OILS



The Chrism Mass is one of the most solemn and important liturgies of the liturgical year. The Mass is a celebration of the institution of the priesthood with Jesus' words at the Last Supper, "Do this in memory of me."

The Mass takes its name from the blessing of the holy oils used in the sacraments throughout the year. Whenever the holy oils are used, the ministry of the bishop who consecrated them is symbolically present. In the decree renewing this rite Pope Paul VI said: "The Chrism Mass is one of the principal expressions of the fullness of the bishop's priesthood and signifies the closeness of the priests with him.

The Holy Oils are:

Chrism – used in the sacraments of Baptism,

- Confirmation and Holy Orders, as well as for the consecration of altars and the dedication of churches.
- The oil of Catechumens also used in the sacrament of Baptism.
- The oil of the sick used in the rite of Anointing of the Sick.

While the Oil of the Catechumens and the Oil of the Sick, are simply "blessed," the Sacred Chrism is

"consecrated,". Holy chrism is a mixture of olive oil and balsam, an aromatic resin. Balsam is poured into the oil, which gives it a sweet smell intended to remind those who encounter it of the "odor of sanctity" to which whose who are marked with it, are called to strive.
