Answer: The Easter Egg is symbolic of the resurrection of Jesus Christ. The eggs were dyed red to represent the blood of Jesus Christ. The hard shell represents the sealed Tomb of Christ, and cracking the shell represents Jesus' resurrection from the dead. The eggs are hidden outside for children to find on Easter morning.
