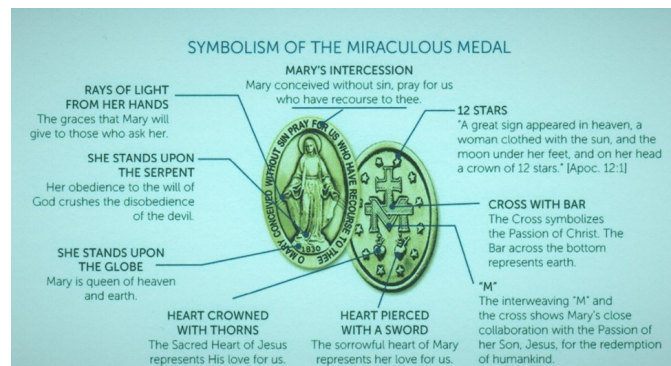
The Rachel Pregnancy Center would like to thank you for participating in our Baby Bottle Drive. This is our primary fundraiser, and makes what we do in the community possible.

A Medal that Changed the World

It began on the night of July 18, 1830, when Our Lady appeared to St. Catherine Laboure a young Daughter of Charity novice. Our Lady then appeared to her again on November 27, 1830. This time when She appeared standing on a globe crushing the head of a serpent with a globe in her hands, rays radiating from her hands, then an oval appeared around Her with the words "O Mary conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee". Our Lady then instructed St. Catherine Laboure to have a medal made after this model. Then the image turned, and Catherine saw the M, intersected at the top with a cross and a bar. Underneath were the hearts of Jesus and Mary with twelve stars surrounding the entire image. With the approval of the Catholic Church were made in 1832 and distributed in Paris. For those who wear a Blessed medal around their neck, graces will be abundant. At the time of St. Catherine's death in 1876 more than a billion medals had been made. Today, the Medal is still drawing down from God blessings for body and soul.



It is very tiny, barely an inch long and half inch wide. It isn't made of silver or gold, yet it is a momentous force in the world.
