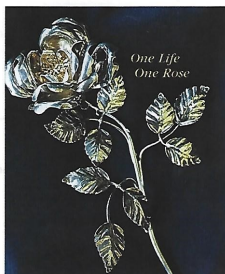
Coming to St. Francis DeSales Cathedral -- July 11, 2022

On Thursday July 14th we celebrate the feast of St. Kateri Tekakwitha who is the first Native American to be recognized as a saint by the Catholic Church. She was born in 1656, in the Mohawk village of Ossemenon. Her mother was an Algonquin, who was captured by the Mohawks and who took a Mohawk chief for her husband.

At the age of four she contracted smallpox that left her badly scared. She often covered her face with a blanket to hide her scars. At the age of 19 she converted to Catholicism, taking the name of Kateri which is Catherine in Mohawk, she also took a vow of chastity. Her decision was not a popular one and some began to accuse her of sorcery, to avoid persecution she fled to a Christian native community south of Montreal.

She was very devout and practiced self-mortification which was common among the Mohawks and prayed for the conversion of her fellow man. At the age of 24 she passed away.

She was canonized by Pope Benedict XVI on Oct 21, 2012. She is the patroness of ecology and the environment, people in exile and Native Americans. (Catholic on line)
