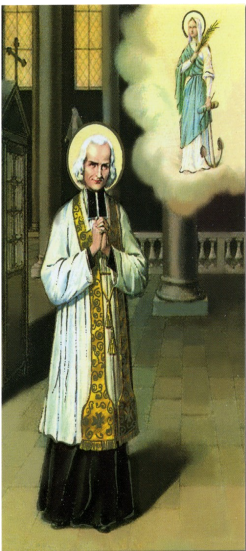

St. John Vianney (8 May 1786-4 August 1859)



Venerated as Saint John Vianney, he was a French Catholic priest who is venerated in the Catholic Church as a saint and as the patron saint of parish priests. He is often referred to as the "Parish Priest of Ars," internationally known for his priestly and pastoral work in his parish in Ars, France, because of the radical spiritual transformation of the community and its surroundings. Catholics attribute this to his saintly life, mortification, preserving ministry in the sacrament of confession, and ardent devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary. His feast day is August 4th.

THE TRANSFIGURATION



In Matthew 16:21-22 Jesus foretells his death and resurrection. "From that time Jesus began to show his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and suffer many things from the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed and on the third day be raised."

Just what is the Transfiguration? According to Matthew 17:1-8 "And after six days Jesus took with him Peter and James and John his brother, and led them up a high mountain apart. And he was transfigured before them, and his face shone like the sun, and his garments became white as light. And behold, here appeared to them Moses and Elijah, talking with him. And Peter said to Jesus, "Lord it is well that we are here; if you wish, I will make three booths here, one for you and one for Moses and one for Elijah." He was still speaking when lo, a bright cloud overshadowed them, and a voice from the cloud said, "**This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him.**" When the disciples heard this, they fell on their faces, and were filled with awe. But Jesus came and touched them, saying, "Rise, and have no fear." And when they lifted up their eyes, they saw no one but Jesus only."

After the Transfiguration Jesus began his journey to Jerusalem knowing he would go through difficult times and die on the cross. Matthew 18:22-23 "As they were gathering in Galilee, Jesus said to them, "The Son of Man is about to be delivered into the hands of men, and they will kill him, and he will be raised on the third day."

At the Transfiguration God the Father commanded us, "**This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him.**" Jesus listened to his Father even though he knew what was in store. Do we listen to God only in good times or do we forget to listen to him when times are difficult? There are times we are asked to speak up or do things we don't want to do or find them very difficult to do. Don't shy away from these times, keep your faith and know God is with you, just listen and He will guide you.
