Divine Mercy in the Second Greatest

Wednesday January 24 is the feast day for our patron Saint Francis de Sales. He was born 21 August 1567 and died 28 December 1622. He is known as the gentleman saint because of his patience and gentleness. He was a great writer and became Bishop of Geneva in 1602. During his life he developed a sign

language to teach a deaf man about God and is the Patron Saint of the deaf and is also Patron Saint of Catholic journalists and press. When in died in 1622, he was buried at the Monastery of the Visitation in Annery. His heart was kept in Lyon France but during the French Revolution it was moved to Venice where it is still venerated today. He was canonized in 1665.
